Fiscal Year-end financial statements should be ready towards the end of August. When comparing our final revenue and expenditure numbers for the fiscal year with our forecasted revenues and expenditures, my revenue comes out to 98.7% accurate and my expenditures come out to 99.6% accurate with the May Forecast.

I would like to thank the staff for being fiscally responsible by staying within their budgets. I'd also like to commend Mitch Voskuhl and our maintenance staff for an excellent job of keeping costs down where possible and doing heavy maintenance in house rather than outsourcing it for a higher cost.

Health Reminders for the Upcoming School Year


As you prepare for the upcoming school year don't forget to review the health information below. Please keep this article all year to help remind you of this important health information.

- If your child has ANY health concerns, please discuss this with your child's teacher
 as well as the school nurse. It is important to do this every year. Please give updates on any of your child's health concerns as often as needed throughout the
 year.
- Be sure to send in your child's updated shot records if your child is in kindergarten, 7th or 12th grade OR you have been notified that your child's shot record is not up to date. This is a state law, and your child can be excluded from school if the proper paperwork is not submitted.
- The medication policy states <u>ALL medication must come in its original container</u>. Absolutely no baggies or any other containers will be accepted.
- Prescription medication MUST have a signed order from the doctor/nurse practitioner who prescribed the medication. No medication can be given without that order. Medication forms are in each building office as well as the nurse's clinic.
- Over the counter medication must have a form filled out by the parent. Those forms can also be found in each of the building offices or the nurse's clinic.
- <u>ALL medication must be checked in with the nurse.</u> Parents or responsible students can bring medication to the building office (high, middle or elementary offices) or directly to the nurse's office.
- Please keep your child home when they are sick. Particularly if they have a fever over 100.4 degrees, vomiting, frequent diarrhea, head lice, any undiagnosed rash, a bad cough, or is too sick to handle normal school activities. Please remember to call the office to report your child's illness. If your child sees a doctor and the doctor requests they be off school, you can bring in a doctor's excuse for those absences. This is not always required, but can be helpful with your child's attendance record.
- Vision and Hearing screenings will be conducted for students in grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11 (vision only for grade 7). You can request a screening be done on your child any time throughout the year by contacting the nurse. Teachers may request this for your child as well.

Give Me a Smile

A fund has been established by an anonymous donor at the Mercer County Civic Foundation to provide orthodontic braces to deserving Coldwater youth. The program provides a free initial screening and then covers the cost of orthodontic braces with little cost to the family for the duration of the treatment. Over the summer, our teachers and staff have been working hard to prepare their classrooms for another outstanding year of instruction, activities, and overall student growth.



As we begin a new school year, you'll notice teachers establishing school standards and classroom expectations. In the most successful classrooms, teachers set routines that help students know what to expect — from where to find and store materials to following a consistent daily schedule. These routines, combined with clear standards and consistent communication with parents, help create class-

rooms where students feel secure, understand their environment, and are positively reinforced for their contributions.

The Coldwater Exempted Village School District is guided by four core values that shape how we work with students, staff, and our community each day:

- Caring Relationships
- Academic Growth
- Valuing Everyone
- A Successful Future



At Coldwater Elementary, we are committed to building great character, leadership, growth, and social skills in our students by living out these core values and doing things "The Cavalier Way." Students will be expected to be safe, kind, respectful, do what is right, and take pride in everything they do.

Our theme for this school year is: "In every way, grow better each day!"

We want every student to focus on giving their best effort in all areas of life — academics, character, behavior, work ethic, and maintaining a growth mindset. Every day brings choices, and we want our students to make positive ones that help them grow while also supporting those around them. No matter the task, our goal is for students to always give their best by being their best selves. We aim to teach every student how to make smart academic, social, and behavioral decisions that help them grow in every aspect of life.

We also encourage families to establish helpful routines at home. As you prepare for the start of school, here are some practical tips to help your child transition smoothly:

Ease Back Into Routines

- Begin adjusting bedtime and wake-up times 1-2 weeks before school starts.
- Re-establish morning and evening routines (meals, screen time limits, reading time).

Review Basic Academic Skills

- Spend 15-20 minutes a day on reading, writing, or math games.
- Practice sight words, math facts, or handwriting.

Read Daily

- Read together or encourage independent reading to build focus and comprehension.
- Let your child choose books that interest them to keep it enjoyable.

Talk Positively About School

- Discuss what they're looking forward to friends, activities, favorite subjects.
- Address any worries by talking through what to expect and providing reassurance.
- Remind them that school will have fun parts, easy and challenging moments, and that the key is always to give their best effort to learn.

Get Organized Early

- Purchase school supplies ahead of time.
- Set up a dedicated space at home for schoolwork and materials.

Encourage Independence

- Practice tasks like packing their backpack, picking out clothes, and organizing belongings.
- Work on personal skills like tying shoes or opening lunch containers.

Promote Healthy Habits

- Reinforce good hygiene practices like handwashing and sneezing into elbows.
- Start planning healthy lunches and snacks and discuss nutrition.

Set Goals

• Help your child set a fun or simple goal for the school year, such as making a new friend or learning a new skill.

Stav Positive as a Parent

• Your attitude about the school year and your child's teacher can greatly influence their mindset. Show enthusiasm and confidence in their abilities!

We are excited about the year ahead and encourage every student to make positive choices that build pride and confidence. We will continue implementing our Coldwater Elementary Positive Behavior Intervention & Supports (PBIS) Program, which helps students develop strong character and social-emotional skills — allowing them to be awesome every day!

Finally, we remain committed to integrating social-emotional learning within our classrooms and school culture. We wish each of our students the opportunity to have their best school year ever!

PBIS at CWEL: A General Overview

"Expecting Excellence"

The main focus of Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is to provide a clear system for all expected behaviors at Coldwater Elementary. While many team members and students have assumptions of what is expected behavior, we cannot assume that everyone's beliefs are similar. Through PBIS, we will work to create and maintain a productive, safe environment in which ALL school community members have clear expectations and understandings of their role in the educational process, thus allowing every Cavalier to *be their best self and pursue excellence*!

The Pursuit of Excellence at Coldwater Elementary

The goal is this at Coldwater Elementary: In our classrooms and school, the expectation is that we do things the right way. Whatever the expectation is; listening attentively, following directions, or walking in the hallway etc. we expect it to be done with excellence. We pursue excellence in everything we do because excellence transfers from the simple and commonplace to more important things like academics, kindness, and respect. The success of our school and students will depend on our team's ability to follow the below expectation: (on the next page)

"Whenever your students don't give you what you want, whether it's the first day of school or the last, stop them in their tracks, ask for and wait for their attention, and then make them do it again until they accomplish the expectation with excellence. Do this whenever they fail to live up to your expectations, and before long, pursuing excellence will become a habit they can't shake."

Proactive Approach to School-Wide Discipline

Schools that implement school-wide systems of positive behavior support focus on taking a team-based system approach and teaching appropriate behavior to all students in the school. Schools that have been successful in building school-wide systems develop procedures to accomplish the following:

- 1. **Behavioral Expectations are Defined.** A small number (3-5) of clearly defined behavioral expectations are defined in positive, simple rules, The Cavalier Way:
 - ♦ Be SAFE
 - Be KIND
 - **♦** Be RESPECTFUL
 - Do What is RIGHT
 - Have PRIDE
 - **2. Behavioral Expectations are Taught.** The behavioral expectations are taught to all students in the building, and are taught in real contexts. Teaching appropriate behavior involves much more than simply telling students what behaviors they should avoid. Specific behavioral examples are:
 - *Be safe* means to act in a way that keeps everyone from harm or danger.
 - *Be kind* means to be friendly, generous, and considerate of others.
 - *Be respectful* means to treat others the way you would like to be treated.
 - *Do what is right* means making the best, most positive, and correct choices.
 - *Have pride* means to be proud of and to be your best self.

Behavioral expectations are taught using the same teaching formats and lesson plans at each grade level. Each expectation is presented, the rationale for the rule is discussed, positive examples ("right way") are described, modeled, and rehearsed, and negative examples ("wrong way") are described and modeled. Videos are also used to model and demonstrate expected school-wide behaviors. Students are given an opportunity to practice the "right way" until they demonstrate correct performance. Teachers are expected to keep students accountable for these procedures throughout the school year and make them redo procedures as many times as needed until they are done correctly and with integrity 100% of the time. Weekly social/emotional lessons and discussions will also be done in each classroom throughout the school year. Doing this will support our students' academic success, reduce behavioral problems and emotional distress, and develop positive social behavior.

- **3. Appropriate Behaviors are Acknowledged.** Once appropriate behaviors have been defined and taught, they need to be acknowledged on a regular basis. CWEL has designed some formal systems that reward positive behaviors.
 - Cav Coins Cav Coins are immediate rewards used by the individual team member, at their discretion, as a tool of encouragement and a student motivator. Use Cav Coins to encourage and reinforce positive behaviors demonstrated on a consistent basis or to give to students who go "above and beyond" the expectation consistently. All team members can award Cav Coins to students, whether they teach them or not. Cav Coins can be turned in by students at the end of each quarter. Students can spend their coins to purchase rewards of their choice at the Cav Coin Store.

- **Positive Behavior Referrals** CWEL Team Members can fill out a Positive Behavior Referral Form about a student at any time. The purpose of this form is to recognize a student for the positive behavior(s) that they have modeled. The form is sent to the office for recognition and to receive a special award. The form is then sent home so parents are aware of this accomplishment.
- **Cavalier Growth Awards** At the end of each quarter, teachers recognize students in their classroom who have demonstrated and/or modeled growth in any area. This could be academics, behavior, character, e effort, etc.
- End of the Year Cavalier Character Awards At the end of the year, teachers recognize one student that has modeled outstanding Cavalier character traits within their classroom and the elementary throughout the year.
- **End of the Year Cavalier Rising Star Awards** At the end of the year, teachers recognize one student that has demonstrated outstanding academic/social growth, as well as worked diligently to improve each day throughout the year.
- End of the Year Cavalier Way Award- At the end of the year, teachers recognize one student in their classroom who has demonstrated and/or modeled The Cavalier Way to the best of their ability the entire school year.
- 4. Behavioral Errors are Corrected Proactively. When students violate behavioral expectations, procedures are needed for providing information to them that their behavior was unacceptable. Correcting, modeling, and having the student or class redo and practice the behavioral expectation is critical in preventing that unacceptable behavior from occurring again. Students, teachers, and all team members should be able to predict what will occur when behavioral errors are identified. Student Incident Reports (SIRs) are used to document and record minor incidents managed by the teacher in the classroom. Office Referral Forms are used to refer major incidents or chronic minor behaviors to the administration. The Behavior Flow Chart is used to help teachers distinguish major from minor behavioral incidents.

Get to know Mrs. Chris Buschur...



If you are unable to attend the open house, and want to get them before the first day of school, you are welcome to stop by the elementary office on Friday or Monday following the open house. If you are unable to make it on those days, don't worry — the kit will remain on your child's desk and be ready for them to use on the first day of school.

Arrival/Departure Information

The elementary school day begins at 8:13 a.m. Students who are not in their classroom by this time will be marked as tardy. Students should not arrive at school prior to 7:50 a.m. as they can not enter their homerooms until 8:00 a.m. Please communicate with your child and their teacher daily dismissal information. It is important that your child knows how they are traveling home so that the Coldwater Elementary team can get every student dismissed properly and safely. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Reminder: Student Drop-Off & Pick-Up Procedures

As we prepare for a safe and smooth start to the school year, we want to remind all families of our arrival and dismissal procedures to ensure student safety.

Please do not drop off or pick up students by vehicle during arrival or dismissal times at the Vine Street/Main Entrance of the elementary building. This area is reserved for our buses only. <u>Likewise</u>, the elementary staff parking lot is not to be used for student drop-off or pick-up at any time.

• We kindly ask that you also avoid parking in any numbered staff parking spots, as these are assigned to school personnel.

For the safest and most efficient drop-off and pick-up process, please use Circle Drive. This area is designed for vehicle traffic and allows for a safe student transition to and from school.

You may also choose to park in the Visitors Parking Lot, but please note:

- Arrival: You must walk your child to the crosswalk and escort them safely across or walk your child to the crosswalk with the crossing guard where they can safely cross.
- Dismissal: You must walk to meet your child at the playground or Circle Drive and escort them back to your car to avoid unsafe crossings in the parking lot.

We will be monitoring these procedures closely, and use of the staff parking lot for student drop-off or pick-up during arrival or dismissal time will be prohibited for safety reasons.

Car Rider Pick-Up: CAVehicle Identification Number TAGS

We will again be using CAVehicle Identification Car Tags for parents/guardians who will be picking students up in a vehicle this year. These tags will be used to help pick up your child through the car rider line in the Circle Drive. This is being done solely for the purpose of increased safety regarding our students. Please read the following carefully as we will adhere to this policy throughout the school year.

If you will be picking up your child, or a group of children at the end of the school day on a regular basis (more than once/week), you will need to please fill out the CAVehicle Identification Number form and return it to the elementary office **BEFORE THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL**, Tuesday, August 19, 2025. This form can be found either one of two ways:

- 1. Go to cw.noacsc.org, then under the "NEWS" tab click on "Final Forms". After you are logged in and click on your child's account, on the "Forms" page you can click on "Car Rider Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures". Here you can copy off the form.
- 2. You also can stop by the elementary office to pick up a form.

If your family has a CAVehicle Identification Tag from last year (meaning you will use the same tag), please mark that on the form. We would also appreciate it if you could take a permanent marker and rewrite your number on the tag so that it can be seen for the upcoming school year.

If you do not have a tag from last year, please fill out the form appropriately and the office will then assign each family or vehicle group a CAVehicle Car Tag. The office will then send home a letter with the assigned identification number, along with as many orange Car Tags" (with identification numbers on them) as needed to be given to any adult that might be picking up your child or vehicle group throughout the school year. There is no cost for the first tag but there is a \$2.00 charge for each additional tag. As your vehicle enters the loading zone, the tag will need to be displayed through the vehicle on the rear view mirror so that staff will be able to read the tag.

If you are the parent of an occasional car rider you have the option of getting a car tag or calling the office on the day your child will be a car rider. I suggest getting a tag if your child is going to be a rider more than once or twice a month. Just remember that on those days when your child is a car rider to display the tag on your rearview mirror.

*It will be vital for your child to know their CAVehicle Identification Number, especially if they are with a group of other students not in the same family.

• Again, if you are filling out the form, please return it to the elementary office before the first day of school, August 19, 2025.

The purpose of the meeting will be to introduce the students to the middle school facility and to talk about some of our rules and expectations. 7TH GRADE CHROMEBOOK PARENT MEETING - (Thursday, August 14th @ 5:00 in the Auditeria.)

Students entering the 7th grade will be issued a Chromebook for the 2025/2026 school year. This Chromebook will be used within the classroom and also will be taken home and cared for by your child every day. This piece of equipment is expected to be at school charged and ready to go every day. For students to receive a Chromebook, parents of 7th-grade students should attend a meeting to review the Chromebook Loan Agreement. **Students will receive their Chromebooks at this meeting if both the parent and student signatures are completed in FINAL FORMS.**

An Open House for the middle school will be held on Thursday, August 14th from 4:30-6:00 PM. Students and parents are invited to attend and tour our facilities and meet the teaching staff.

<u>CHROMEBOOK CARE</u> - Parents, We need your help!

We ask that you please discuss proper Chromebook care with your child for the coming school year. Chromebook damages were found to be at an all-time high as the tech department took inventory of the student Chromebooks this past summer. Although our tech department is AWESOME at fixing damaged Chromebooks, they have way more important things to do. Please express to your child that they must care for their Chromebook because they will have it throughout their schooling career at Coldwater.

- 1. Please do not eat or drink around your Chromebook. We have had to fix many mechanical issues over the summer and many of these issues have stemmed from sticky spillage and crumbs stuck in the keyboards.
- 2. Do not carry your Chromebook one-handed by the screen. This many times damages the screen and also damages the hinges that connect the screen to the keyboard.
- 3. Do not slam the Chromebook screen shut abruptly. Slowly close the screen with care.
- 4. When transporting your Chromebook from class to class and especially to and from school, the Chromebook should always be placed in its protective case. **Do not carry your Chromebook in your bookbag without being inside its protective case.**

NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION

MIDDLE SCHOOL FALL COOKIE DOUGH FUNDRAISER (September 15th - September 29th)



GRADE LEVEL ENTRANCE PROCEDURES

Students will not be permitted into the building until 8:00 each morning unless they are here for a special meeting, practice, or activity. In case of inclement weather or frigid temperatures, students will be allowed to enter the building at 7:50 AM and report to the Auditeria until the 8:00 bell rings. The warning bell will ring at 8:08 and announcements will begin at 8:10. All students are expected to be seated in their first-period class by 8:10, however, the 8:13 bell is the tardy bell. The following will be the entrances for each grade level. *Please note that this pertains to walkers and car riders only.*

- **5th grade** Use the south parking lot doors that enter into the 5th-grade hallway.
- **6th grade** Use the south parking lot doors that enter into the 6th-grade hallway.
- **7th grade -** Use the MS front entrance to enter the school.
- **8th grade** Use the MS front entrance to enter the school.

*****All students arriving after 8:13 are to use the main entrance of the middle school on Market St and check in at the office before going to class.



As stated in the student handbook, good attendance is a very important part of having a successful school year.

- 1. Parents or guardians are expected to call the middle school by 9:13 a.m. to report a student's absence and inform the school of the reason for the absence.
 - A. If a parent/guardian fails to call, the following will take place.
 - i. 1st, 2nd, 3rd offense Secretary calls the parent and warns after 3 times, the absence will be unexcused.
 - ii. 4th offense Secretary calls the parent, absence is unexcused, the truant officer is called and the student will receive a 30-minute detention.

2. If a student misses more than 10 days in a school year, he or she will be required to bring in a doctor's excuse slip for any subsequent absences due to illness or medical. Absences prior to this with a doctor's excuse will not count toward the 10.

MIDDLE SCHOOL CELL PHONE RULES

Cell Phones are prohibited in the school.

- 1. If a student has a cell phone, it must be powered down at all times and in the student's locker.
- 2. Students may not use a cell phone in the school for any reason unless directed by school personnel.
- 3. Cell phones will be taken away if they are not in the student's locker.
 - 1st Offense Cell phone housed in the office for the day.
 - 2nd Offense Cell phone housed in the office for the day and parents contacted.
 - 3rd Offense & thereafter Cell phone housed in the office for the day, 60-minute detention, and cell phone must be picked up by a parent.

(PARENTS: Please do not text your child at school and expect them to respond while at school.)

DRESS CODE REMINDER

Proper dress, manners, and attitudes will be expected at all times. Each student should realize that how he or she dresses affects his/her behavior and the behavior of other students as well. The following dress code will help to maintain a proper learning environment:

- 1. Hats, headbands, and other garments worn around the head are not permitted if they violate the intent of the dress code.
- 2. Clothing may not be disruptive to the educational system.
- 3. Shirts with sleeves removed or leaving the armpit exposed, or shirts showing the student's stomach may not be worn unless another shirt is worn underneath.
- 4. Shirts displaying chemical advertisements (alcohol, drugs, tobacco, drug paraphernalia) shall not be worn.
- 5. Pants/jeans or shorts, which are tattered, torn, or with any holes may not be worn if they are deemed, by the principal, to be a distraction to the education process. No cut off shorts permitted. Shorts and skirts must be of modest length.
- 6. Pants must be worn at the hip at all times.
- 7. Dress and grooming standards require cleanliness in the interest of health, sanitary conditions, and safety requirements.
- 8. When a student is participating in school activities, his/her dress and grooming will not disrupt his/her performance or that of other students or constitute a health threat to himself or other students.
- 9. Chains (that do not include jewelry) may not be worn. (Ex: chains that connect billfolds to pants and those worn on jackets)

No shoes with wheels are permitted.

***The principal reserves the right to make judgments concerning other questionable/disruptive modes of dress.



Arrival - Dismissal Procedures 25/26

Below is a map and procedures for arrival and dismissal for the 25/26 school year. Student drop off and pick up will be in the circle drive for the elementary school and the south parking lot for the middle school. The buses will be lined up on Vine St. for both drop off and pick up.

Arrival

Walkers and Car riders:

5th grade enters from MS south hallway doors 6th grade enters from MS south hallway doors 7th/8th grade enters MS main entrance

Bus students:

Exit the bus and either enter the Elementary School front entrance or walk around the Elementary to Circle Drive, and enter the HS Circle Drive entrance to MS. *Bad weather* - travel through the elementary, the Pit, and the HS to MS.


Departure


Bussers:

Must exit MS by walking behind the Auditeria stage to the HS circle drive exit. Stay on the sidewalk heading toward the playground and then to the front of the Elementary where buses are parked.

<u>Walkers/Bikers:</u> Students must use designated crosswalks. Students are never allowed to cross between cars in pickup lines.

- *West town* Use the main entrance to exit or 7th-grade hallway doors and use the crosswalk.
- <u>East town</u> Exit any south door and walk down the sidewalk to the crosswalk leading to the central office or exit HS Commons front entrance using the crosswalk in front of the high school.
- <u>North town</u> 1. Follow bussers and exit into Circle Drive 2. Exit the MS front entrance, use the crosswalk, and head down the sidewalk toward playground 3. Exit out the HS Commons doors using the crosswalk in front of the high school.
- <u>South town</u> Exit the MS front entrance or any south door and walk down the sidewalk to the designated crosswalk.





Academic Rewards System

Not only do we like to reward positive behavior, but also outstanding academic performance. At the end of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quarters, we will have an honor roll breakfast celebrating the academic performance of our honor roll students. To be invited, 5th and 6th-grade students need to achieve B's and higher (no B- allowed), and 7th and 8th-grade students need to achieve at least a 9.0 GPA. Invitations will be placed in the students' lockers. If students achieve the honor roll all 3 nine weeks, they will be invited to a pancake breakfast during the last week of school. This is a great incentive and something for the students to work toward.

PBIS - Positive Behavior Intervention and Support

Coldwater Middle School will continue implementing our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) program this school year. The goal of PBIS is to encourage and recognize students for demonstrating positive behavior throughout the school day.

Students will have the opportunity to earn rewards twice a year—once at the semester break in January and again at the end of the school year. Each semester is divided into three PBIS periods. To be eligible for the semester reward, a student must qualify in at least two out of the three periods.

Student behavior is monitored using a building-wide tracking system. Strikes are issued for various behavioral infractions, and the office maintains a spreadsheet to record these. At the end of each PBIS period, students who exceed the established strike threshold will receive a detention and will be disqualified from that PBIS period. If a student is disqualified for two of the three periods in a semester, they will not be eligible for the semester reward.

Parents will be notified via email whenever their child receives a strike. This communication is intended to keep families informed and to encourage timely conversations and support at home.

Our goal is to support positive behavior and create a safe, respectful, and inclusive environment for all students.

Attention 8th Grade Parents/Students:

Our last meeting in preparation for this year's Washington DC trip will be on Monday evening September 22nd at 7:00 p.m. in the Auditeria. Students are expected to sit with their parent(s) as several important items will be discussed: rooming lists, bus list, touring groups, itinerary, packing list, etc....

Also, a **chaperone meeting** will be on Monday evening October 6th at 7:00 p.m. in the Pound. This meeting is for chaperones only, and chaperone responsibilities will be discussed/explained. Welcome Back to School

Important Coldwater Cafeteria Information for **2025-2026** School Year

Dear Families,

We are excited to welcome everyone back for a new school year! Please review these important updates and reminders about our school meal program and payment procedures.

Free and Reduced Lunch Applications:

- -New free and reduced meal applications are now available.
- -Pick up a paper application in the office or complete one online through your PaySchools Central account.
- -Applications must be filled out every new school year after July 1, even if you qualified last year.

If you were on free/reduced meals last year, you have a 30-day grace period starting August 19, 2025. After that, if you have not reapplied or been directly certified, your status will change to paid on September 19, 2025.

Watch for a letter about your meal status around September 1.

-Some families may be asked to verify their income starting October 1, as part of the federal process.

ALL STUDENTS PaySchools Central Account:

- -All families, especially those with new Kindergarten students, should REGISTER an account at (https://www.payschoolscentral.com/).
- You will need your child's student ID/lunch number.
- Use PaySchools Central to check meal balances, pay school fees, and add money to your child's account.

ALL STUDENTS Charging & Buying Extra Items:

- Students must have money in their account to buy any extra food or à la carte items (like extra milk, juice, water, or snacks).
- Free and reduced meal benefits do NOT cover extra items or drinks bought separately. Money must be in the account for these purchases.
- Please talk to your child about not using a sibling's account. If we notice this happening regularly without money being added, we will contact you.

Reminders:

- All students need money in their account for any extras or à la carte items.

- Free/reduced lunch covers only the standard reimbursable meal defined by the National School Lunch Program (NSLP).
- -Any extra items, snacks, or drinks purchased separately (such as an extra milk, juice, or water) are considered à la carte and are not covered by free or reduced meal benefits. Money must be in all student accounts for these purchases. This is also for all free/reduced students that pack lunches and want to get a drink.
- Stay up to date with lunch balances and purchases by checking your PaySchools Central account.

<u>Understanding The National School</u> <u>Lunch/Breakfast Program and a</u> <u>Reimbursable Meal</u>

A reimbursable meal meets nutrition standards set by the National School Lunch
Program (NSLP) for lunch or the School Breakfast Program (SBP) for
breakfast, qualifying for free or reduced-price benefits.

Reimbursable Lunch Requirements:

- Students must select at least 3 of 5 components, including one fruit or vegetable:
 - Meat/Meat Alternate (e.g., chicken, cheese)
 - Grain (e.g., bread, pasta)
 - Fruit
 - Vegetable
 - Milk
- Examples:
- Chicken sandwich, carrot sticks, and milk
- Cheese pizza, apple slices, and milk

Reimbursable Breakfast Requirements:

- Students must select at least 3 of 4 components, including 1 fruit or vegetable:
 - Grain (e.g., cereal, toast)
 - Fruit (or vegetable)
 - Milk
 - Meat/Meat Alternate (e.g., eggs, yogurt)
- Examples:
- · Cereal, juice, and milk
- Yogurt, banana, and toast

Note: Students must meet the minimum component requirements for meals to be reimbursable or they can be charged for a incomplete meal at \$2.75.


